FACULTY

Kevin Simmons, M.D.

Dr. Simmons is a psychiatrist and the medical director of the Mobile Crisis Outreach Team (MCOT) of the Mental Health Mental Retardation Authority of Harris County. In this position, Dr. Simmons oversees a staff of 30 mental health professionals who respond to 270 referrals each month. Dr. Simmons received his medical doctorate from the University of Texas and completed a Fellowship Training in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry at the Baylor College of Medicine.

Mike Lee, M.A.

Lieutenant Lee is the manager of the Houston Police Department's Mental Health Unit (MHU). He has a master's degree in sociology and psychology with an additional 37 post-graduate hours in psychology. He is a member of the department's Hostage Negotiation Team and is a graduate of the Law Enforcement Management Institute at Sam Houston State University. Lt. Lee received the Houston Police Department's Mid Manager of the Year Award in 2009.

Frank Webb, M.Ed.

Frank is a senior police officer in the Houston Police Department's Mental Health Unit. Officer Webb coordinated Houston's CIT Program from 1999 to 2006, when the program expanded and was placed under a lieutenant. Officer Webb was the Discipline Chair of the TCLEOSE committee that developed the CIT curriculum for the Basic Peace Officers' Course and was selected to teach the state-mandated 16-hour CIT class to all Texas police chiefs. He received the Houston Police Department's Officer of the Year Award in 2000.

Rebecca Skillern, M.A., LPC-S

Rebecca is a Police Officer/Investigator in the Houston Police Department's Mental Health Unit. Officer Skillern is one of the original HPD Crisis Intervention Response Team (CIRT) officers and has been with the MHU since July 2008. Prior to joining HPD, Officer Skillern received her B.S. in Psychology and her M.A. in Marriage & Family Therapy at the University of Houston at Clear Lake. She is a Licensed Professional Counselor-Supervisor.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This training is designed for law enforcement personnel to prepare them to teach crisis intervention classes to law enforcement officers. The training is also valuable for mental health professionals who want to assist teaching these classes.
